OLD BUSINESS:

Sergeant Dillon stated him, and Chief Workman will be meeting with Synergy the week of February 12th to get a lay of Loami for village wide camera's, body camera's for the police department and video conferencing to live stream the village board meetings. Sergeant Dillon suggested to the board that the village office will need to get an alarm system through CLS which is the same company that the police department has their alarm system with.

Mayor Lambert stated the handbook is ready to be adopted within the next few weeks. Mayor Lambert asked the board if they had any comments/edits and if so, they need to let Clerk Grider know.

Mayor Lambert stated he and Treasurer Colantino meet with trustee department heads to review the budget for 2024/2025 fiscal year.

NEW BUSINESS:

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

PARKS – Trustee Patterson stated he spoke with William Roesch and Trustee Patterson would like to recoat the playground equipment and put an overhead picnic table area by the reservoir.

STREETS DEPARTMENT – Trustee Pippin stated William Roesch is in contact of a local individual about cleaning up ditches on the east end of the Village of Loami.

POLICE DEPARTMENT – Chief Workman stated the police department was a busy month for January. Chief Workman submitted the Police Report to the board, which is on file at the Clerk's office.

PERMITS – Trustee Mann stated there were zero (0) permit issued for January 2024.

DELINQUENT BILLS – Trustee Grider stated there were two (2) shutoffs for the month of January.

WATER/SEWER DEPARTMENT – Trustee Grider stated he will get in contact with William Roesch to discuss a plan for the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds.

PUBLIC SAFETY –Chief Workman stated him, and Trustee Mann will meet to look at potential ordinance violations. Mayor Lambert asked if the rock pile in the village parking lot would pose a problem with clean-up day. Clerk Grider stated she will get with William Roesch to get a plan to ensure the layout will work.
